He has served as a visiting scholar at institutions such as the Federal Reserve, IMF, and World Bank, and regularly advises governments and international organizations on trade dynamics, tariffs, and economic diplomacy. A compelling speaker, Irwin translates complex trade issues into accessible, thought-provoking presentations that connect past lessons with current challenges.
