He was a weekly economic analyst in the news show "Hechos", TV Azteca, 1994-2004. He is now an occasional commentator for CNN, CNN Latinamerica, CNCB, Reuters, National Public Radio, BBC Radio, ADN40, and others.

He has delivered over 900 lectures in Mexico, the U.S., Canada, several countries in Central and South America, and throughout Europe and Asia.

He has testified before the U.S. Congress on NAFTA and free trade, structural reform in Mexico, and monetary and exchange rate policy.
